Adding to its best aesthetics and craftsmanship it preserves engineering with artisan sensibilities to harmoniously blend form with function.

Behind the brand is the visionary creative force of Bhrigu Arora, the Founder, and Engineer at The Tone Door. He believes that music and musicians have the profound purpose of making this world a better place. Renowned for his innovative ideas that have propelled The Tone Door from just a cable-making venture in Yamunanagar, Haryana to move to New Delhi and serve the entire music & entertainment circuit. Bhrigu's love for electronics and music led him to create utilities for musicians, making them available in the best quality. Having spent the early college years designing electronic projects in the semester & learning music. He eventually discovered his love for musical instruments and their functionality, which eventually gave birth to The Tone Door brand.



SHRUTHI MUSICALS: CREATING HISTORY SINCE 1985

Thruthi Musicals was established in 1985 by Manohar Lal, recognized a significant gap in the availability of music stores in the city, particularly in the Kilpauk area and its surroundings. Driven by his passion for music, he took the initiative to open a modest music shop. This small establishment initially focused on fulfilling the demand for Indian musical instruments, along with a selection of Western instruments and accessories, at a time when imported goods were scarce due to high duty rates, often exceeding 100%. The locally made instruments available were not of the finest quality. Eventually, a manufacturer in Calcutta began producing guitars under the name Givson, which boasted superior craftsmanship compared to local options, offering excellent playability and tone. Shruthi Musicals was the pioneer in introducing Givson to Chennai, and this move resonated deeply with musicians, turning into a remarkable success. In the early 90s, we proudly launched a P.A. brand from Calcutta called Stranger, which quickly

became a hit, making high-quality amps and speakers accessible to schools and churches. Shruthi maintained a close relationship with its customers, recognizing the significant gap in the availability of premium keyboards, drum kits, and guitars. To address this, we initiated an instrument rental service, empowering musicians to showcase their talents. Following the economic policy shift in 2000, which reduced duty structures, we began to high-quality instruments source popular brands. Seizing this golden opportunity, Shruthi Musicals introduced renowned names like Fender, Ibanez, Cort, and PRS to the Chennai market, enriching the musical landscape and inspiring countless artists. This transformed the way people perceived Shruthi Musicals, shifting from a typical store focused on Indian instruments to a vibrant hub offering a wide array of western musical options. In 2000, Shailendra, the son of Manohar Lal and a talented guitarist himself, joined the team and played a pivotal role in introducing renowned brands to Shruthi Musicals, including exclusive names like Parker Guitars, Godin Guitars, and PRS. Additionally, we fostered a community where musicians could come together, showcase their skills, and collaborate with fellow artists, creating an atmosphere of creativity and expression.

Paired with an SSH pickup setup, it delivers a vibrant sound that cuts through any mix, making it an indispensable ally for every guitarist. This pedal elevates tone saturation by driving the amp's front end, and the "AIR" knob offers customizable presence, making versatile it а qem overdrive/distortion world. The AT+ captures classic rock and fierce metal tones, unlocking limitless sonic possibilities. Crafted by JHS pedals, it features user-friendly controls that enhance performance, capturing every nuance from pick attack to harmonics. Running on under 100 ma with a 9V adapter or batteries, it can also handle 18V. Housed in a durable metal case, it's perfect for touring, with three wattage options that make it an excellent low-volume practice companion.
